Remembering Shirley Colabella

In this issue of the re-Chant, we would like to pay tribute to Shirley Colabella. Shirley and her husband, Frank, moved here from Plainsboro in 2014. Sadly, Shirley passed away on November 8, 2021, after bravely battling breast cancer for 22



years. Frank recalled meeting Shirley at Elgin Air Force Base in Fort Walton Beach, Fla. Shirley was an Air Force "brat" and was raised in Europe. They were set up by a mutual friend. She captured his heart, and they were married on July 4, 1969. They had three children and six grandchildren.

Many in our community knew Shirley, and we would like to highlight her for the impact she made on the numerous people with whom she came in contact. Her friends here at Enchantment use words like positive, inspiring, brave, and resilient when describing her. During the 22 years that she battled breast cancer, Shirley was very active as a volunteer with the Robert Wood Johnson Cancer Center. She distributed lunches at the infusion center and often sat with patients while they were getting their treatments. She participated in fundraisers and was a speaker at certain events.

While speaking of his late wife, Frank recalls a lively and outgoing lady who encouraged him to travel with her to many places, including Europe and Alaska. She was an active member of the Enchantment community. She joined the Chantones singing group, chair exercise, Social Committee, and the Sunshine Club. Shirley loved crafting...knitting, crocheting and jewelry making. She loved gardening, bird watching, and shopping. Little did Frank know how much Shirley loved shopping! He discovered that her craft room was overflowing with supplies.... yarn, knitting and crocheting, needles, beads, precious gems, and tools and machines necessary for making jewelry. Continuing with Shirley's generous spirit, Frank donated the yarn to the Knitters and Crafters Club here in Enchantment. The ladies made blankets that were donated to Mobile Meals of Hamilton and the Veteran's Home in Mercer County. They will soon begin making lap blankets for cancer patients to use while getting treatments. The beads, semi-precious gems, and tools were given to a young man named Ben. Ben is 16 years old and has a small business called Jewelry by Ben. He sells his jewelry on consignment at a small shop in Allentown N.J. Ben was so appreciative that he made jewelry for Shirley's children and grandchildren as mementos of their loving mother and grandmother.


Shirley's spirit lives on, and we are certain she is very proud of Frank's generosity.

RED LENTIL SOUP WITH LEMON (ADAPTED FROM THE NEW YORK TIMES, 2008)

This is a winner: deep flavor, beautiful color, easy to throw



together in an hour. There's no need to rinse or soak the lentils. If you're not a lentil lover (I am not), red lentils might win you over.

Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons olive oil, more for drizzling
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tablespoon tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/4 teaspoon kosher salt, more to taste
- ¹/₄ teaspoon ground black pepper
- Pinch of ground chili powder or cayenne, more to taste
- 1 quart chicken or vegetable broth
- 2 cups water
- 1 cup red lentils
- 1 large carrot, peeled and diced
- Juice of 1/2 medium lemon, more to taste

3 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro (or for cilantro haters, parsley)

Directions

In a large pot, (enameled cast iron works well) heat 3 tablespoons oil over medium-high heat until hot and shimmering. Add onion; sauté until soft, about 4 minutes. Reduce heat to medium, add garlic, and continue until it is just golden. Stir in tomato paste, cumin, salt, black pepper, and chili powder or cayenne, and sauté for about 2 minutes longer until the paste darkens a bit, and the spices are fragrant.

Add broth, 2 cups water, lentils, and carrot. Give all a good stir. Bring to a simmer, then partially cover pot, and turn heat to medium-low. Simmer until lentils are soft, about 30 minutes, stirring occasionally. Taste and add salt if necessary.

Using a blender or food processor, purée half the soup, then add it back to pot. Soup should be somewhat chunky. Stir in lemon juice, and drizzle with olive oil.

Leonard Petruska, 82, is celebrating 22 years since his life-saving liver transplant. To document his journey, Len published an article on the NJ Sharing Network website this past July. In 1998, I became very ill and was told to get my affairs in order as the doctors told me I had only about 12 months to live. I was in desperate need of a liver transplant. My name was added to the transplant waiting list, where I remained for two years before a donor's organ was available.

During the Memorial Day weekend in 2000, Thomas Sozzi, a local business owner and amateur drag race car driver, was hit head-on by a school bus and in critical condition. Tracey, his wife, recalled Thomas saying if something ever happened to him, he would want his organs donated so others might live.

After the transplant, the following months were filled with


recovery and rehabilitation. I was incredibly grateful for being given a second chance at life. Life took on a new meaning. I was more in love with my family and friends. Everything about everything took on new dimensions and appreciation.

I felt compelled to write my donor family with the support of the NJ Sharing Network team. On a Thanksgiving Day, Tracey called me, and we ended our conversation making plans for our families to meet the day after Christmas. Since then, our families remain in close contact as they will always be in our hearts and prayers.

Apart from general organ transplant protocol, I have led quite a normal life. In all these years since my life-saving transplant, it is easy to forget my wait for this transplant until bedtime when I thank God and pray for the donor and his family.

Over the last 22 years, I have made it a priority to support organ and tissue donation and transplantation by sharing my story. Organ and tissue donation does not have an age limit. The easiest way to register is on your NJ Driver's License or online <u>www.njsharingnetwork.com</u>.
